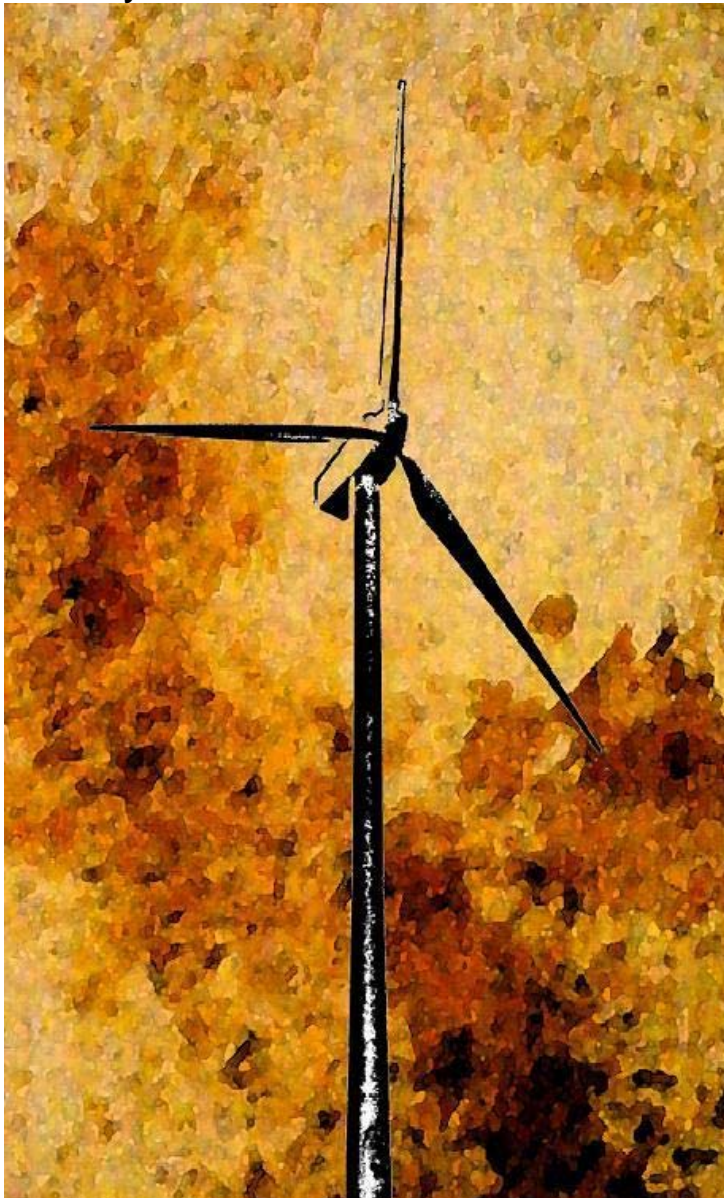

### and Saturday all-day plenary sessions and workshops addressing the following themes



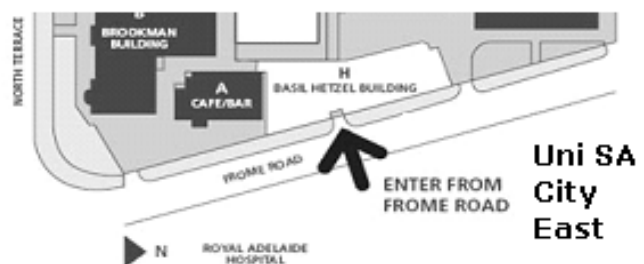
- This is an Emergency - An Introduction to the Real Science of Global Warming
